

World Children's Day is celebrated on November 20th every year to promote international togetherness, awareness among children worldwide, and improving children's welfare.




Pediatric and the Eye

Pediatric Eye Screenings

 $\dot{\mathbf{A}}$

- Early diagnosis and treatment is vital for many paediatric eye conditions.
- Any eye condition raised during routine health checks, such as those by a maternal and child health nurse or GP, should be taken seriously and a prompt eye examination carried out.

Comprehensive Paediatric Eye Screenings will involve

- History–Basic Elements (Pediatric History, Developmental History, Pregnancy/Birth History).
- Visual Acuity Cover Test
- Stereo Acuity
- Color Vision
- Near Point of Convergence

Comprehensive Paediatric Eye Screenings will involve

- Oculomotility Test ited
- Confrontation Visual Fields

- Pupils
- Dry & Wet Refraction (if obtainable)
- Anterior Segment Evaluation (if obtainable)
- Tonometry
- Posterior Segment Evaluation



DRAG TO THE SIDE BRAG TO THE SIDE

Frequency of eye examinations

- Birth-2 years: 6-12 months of age
- Age 3-5 years: at least once annually
- Age 6-18 years: before first grade, annually thereafter.

*Any child is considered "at-risk" for ocular disease or disorder should be seen as recommended by an eye care professional.
